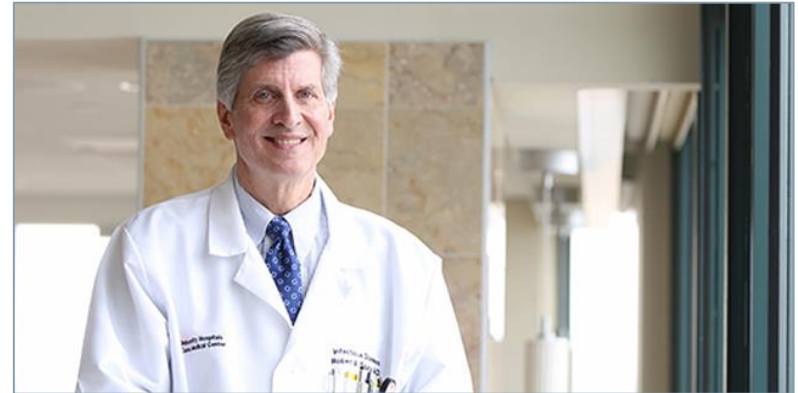

# Moving at the Speed of Science – COVID Clinical Trials

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Your support is fueling clinical trials moving closer to a COVID-19 vaccine.

UH is the **only hospital in the U.S.** conducting five COVID-related clinical trials:

- Pfizer
- AstraZeneca/Oxford
- Massimo
- Antibody Treatment
- Remdesivir Treatment



## Pfizer Vaccine Clinical Trial

- One of 125 sites to get vaccine trial – only site in Northeast Ohio
- Interim results show vaccine is 95% effective
- UH enrolled 170 people, age 18 to 85



## AstraZeneca/Oxford Vaccine Clinical Trial

- One of 80 sites in U.S. for Phase 3 global study
- Late-stage trials showed vaccine up to 90% effective

# Community Response Fund Impact

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**Plasma - Hyperimmune Globulin**, clinical trial to develop therapy made from blood donated by people who have recovered from the virus. Can be administered to COVID-19 patients.

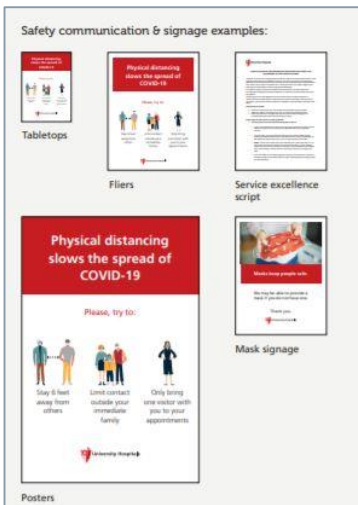


**iPads for patient use**, these devices will allow any UH patient to connect with family and friends who cannot visit due to the current visitor restrictions at UHCMC.

# Community Response Fund Impact



**Antibody Testing for Caregivers, UH conducting COVID-19 antibody testing for our frontline caregivers and first responders. UH aims to test at least 10,000 frontline caregivers and first responders.**



**Healthy Restart Playbook, UH created and published a comprehensive toolkit to help businesses, schools and community organizations open and maintain safety while protecting employees, customers and the public. The Playbook has received national attention and been downloaded more than 7,000 times.**

# COVID-19 Directed Support

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Nearly \$800,000 raised by our community for directed support.

UH Rainbow Babies & Children's received a \$200,000 gift from Hyundai Hope On Wheels, a non-profit organization supported by Hyundai Motor America and its U.S. dealers, in support of COVID-19 drive-thru testing.



UH was one of the **first health systems in Ohio** to launch drive-thru testing for COVID-19.

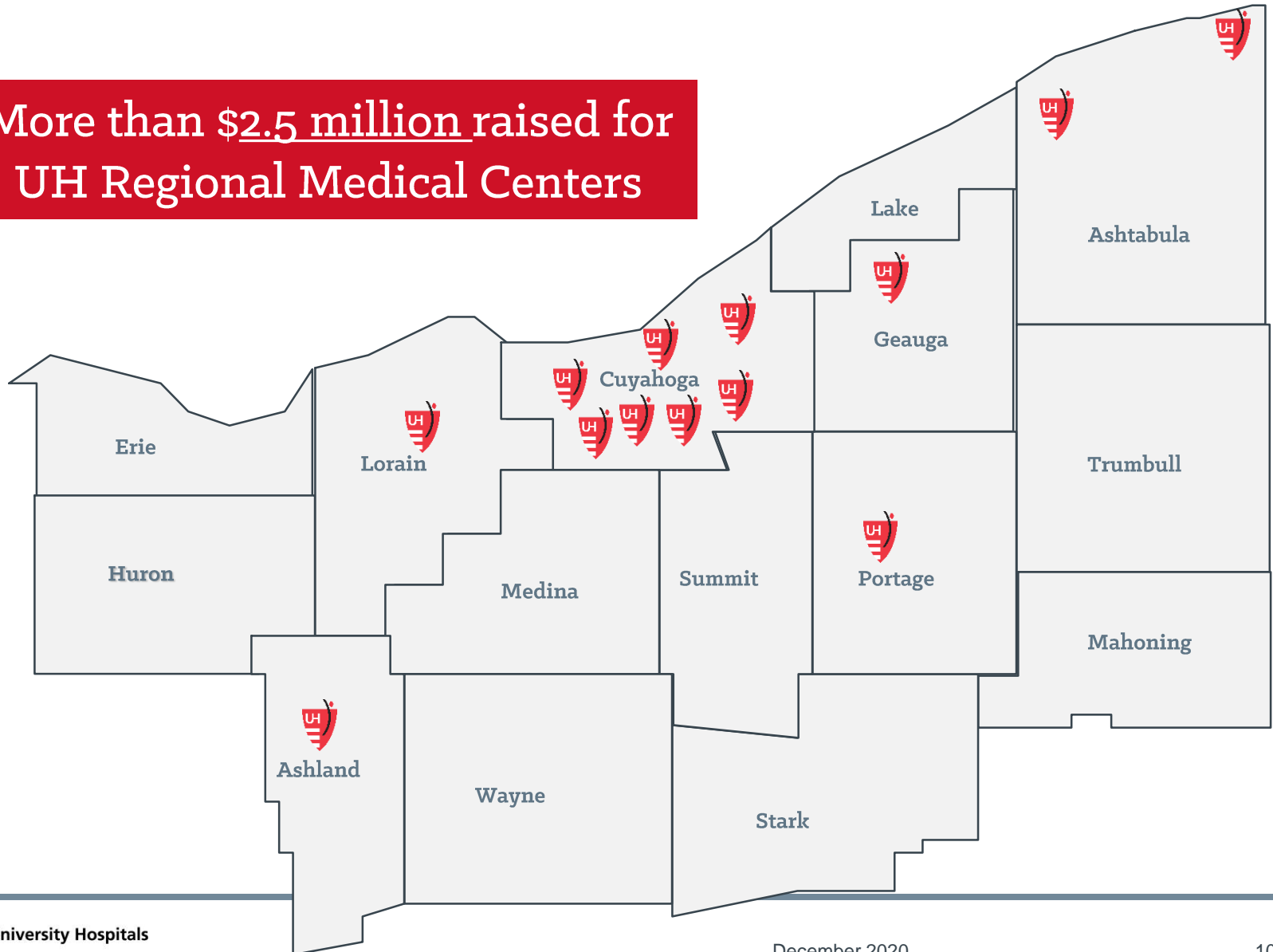


### **Don't be Afraid to Ask**
